BARANGAY HISTORY

Burnay is an <u>llocano</u> term for a big earthen jar or "tapayan" for the tagalog speaking inhabitants.

Accordingly, during the pioneering settlement period, the exodus of the early settlers from the Ilocano speaking north came to this place when it was still in its "virgin" stage where towering large trees dominated then the area and could be mistaken as a forest area. While clearing the place for agricultural purposes (it was then only sitio of the adjoining Barangay Valle), the early settlers found a hidden pit full of neatly stock filed huge earthen jars, some still filled with the locally fermented "basi" wine obtained from sugar cane juice and some jars already empty, left behind by hurriedly departing moon-shiners maybe for fear of being discovered and apprehended by the local authorities. When this early settlers finally settled for good, relatives and friends from the north came to visit and when they saw the pit of big earthen jars, in awe and wonder in their faces, one single word echoed dominantly from the rest of the expression on their lips: "BURNAY". From then on the sitio was officially named Burnay and eventually became a barangay in 1946. Among the first dwellers were migrants from Aliaga and San Miguel in Bulacan. They first dwell in the riverbanks during war and transferred to the barrio site after the war.
