

## BARANGAY HISTORY

Barangay Collado is a part of the Hacienda Jacinto, but the farm lands here were sold by Estefania del Rosario, wife of Don Andres Jacinto to Eugenio Baltao who later sold it to Alejandro Lim, the present owner.

Most of the dwellers in the place were Ilocanos from the town of Licab and Sto. Domingo, Gerona and Camiling in Tarlac and Urdaneta, Pangasinan. The first to dwell the place in 1915 includes the family Collado, Simeon Pablo, Alejandro Roniel, Valentin Regaton, Agaton Gabao, Blas Bueno, Andres Viterbo, Simeon Bagsac, Jose Valdez, Dionisio Castillo, Santiago Pablo, Lorenzo Pablo, Elias Transfiguracion, Cecilio Castillo, Ireneo Mariano, Herminigildo Pablo, Jose Aquino, Honorato Pablo, and Jorge Pablo. The small group of tagalog were from the province of Bulacan.

It should be noted that the first families who reside in the place were the family Collado. It is a big family. That is why, more often than not if someone asked the name of the place, the people will reply Collado. If someone asked where they were going they immediately reply, In Collado. So it was named Collado when it finally became a barangay. However, the family Collado left the place and they didn't return from then on.

The patron saint of the place is the Nazarene, and the feast day is every 9<sup>th</sup> of January. The first "Tinyente del Baryo" of Collado is Pedro Marcelo, the one who registered the place in the Municipal Hall of Talavera.
