

## BARANGAY HISTORY

Barangay Baluga is located one kilometer east of barangay Pinagpanaan. Baluga was also a sitio of the said barangay. The said barangay is one of the barrios, which was well developed when it comes to agriculture.

Accordingly, the first to dwell in the place were natives like Baluga and Igorots. These natives were both engaged in hunting wild animals, which are so many in this forest like place. Hunting, however, became their means of livelihood. These two tribes of Baluga and Igorot were never united. They were oftenly fighting one another and against each other, with the idea that only one tribe should reign and dwell in the place.

Until one day, the Igorots through a trap, which they prepared, the chieftain of the Baluga tribe was killed. He was Captain Taruru. Baluga natives were so fearful with the fate of their chief so they decided to leave the place. When the Igorots were starting to clear the place, after the Balugas left, a group of Ilocanos and Tagalogs came and instructed them to vacate the place. So, they went away, until they noticed the grave of Baluga's Chieftain. Because of this situation, they named the place Baluga.

Among the first were Alejandro Llamas, Sixto Grospe, Perfecto Mudlong, Cirilo Ibarra, Macario Punay, Eusebio Navarro, Florencio Cajugao, Ciriaco Pagaduan, Basilio dela Merced, Florencio Ramos, Camilo Tolentino, Pedro Domingo, Rosendo Garcia, Guillermo Villamar, Felix Pumaras, Mateo Tolentino, Alfonso Afan, Clemente Afan, Roman Damaso, Francisco Damaso, Francisco Domingo, Albino Villadolid, Benigno Tolentino, Antonio Gutierrez, Basilio Sebastian, Joaquin Sandan, Florencio Ibarra and Arcadio Saoit.

Baluga was first named Caisiwan, since the place was being used as headquarters of the revolutionaries during the Spanish regime. And Baluga was finally separated from Pinagpanaan and became a barangay by a petition by the residents. Which was resolved by the Municipal Council.
